I&EC Fellow Categories

I&EC Fellow (up to two awarded annually)

A chemist or engineer from an academic, industrial, or government laboratory who has made significant, innovative contributions to the area of applied chemistry or engineering over the course of their career. The awardees will be recognized at and be asked to contribute a talk to the I&EC awards symposium (typically at the spring meeting the ACS) and will receive free registration for this ACS meeting, be reimbursed up to \$1000 towards travel, and be given 1 year free membership to the I&EC Division. While not required, it is customary for the nominator to organize an honorary symposium around the nominee's area of expertise in conjunction with the I&EC Programming Chair.

I&EC International Fellow (up to one awarded annually)

A chemist or engineer currently working outside of the United State of America from an academic, industrial, or government laboratory who has made significant, innovative contributions to the area of applied chemistry or engineering over the course of their career. The awardees will be recognized at and be asked to contribute a talk to the I&EC awards symposium (typically at the spring meeting the ACS) and will receive free registration for this ACS meeting, be reimbursed up to \$2500 towards travel, and be given 1 year free membership to the I&EC Division. While not required, it is customary for the nominator to organize an honorary symposium around the nominee's area of expertise in conjunction with the I&EC Programming Chair.

I&EC Early Career Fellow (up to one awarded annually)

An early career (40 years old or younger) chemist or engineer from an academic, industrial, or government laboratory who has made significant, innovative contributions to the area of applied chemistry or engineering over the course of their career. The awardees will be recognized at and be asked to contribute a talk to the I&EC awards symposium (typically at the spring meeting the ACS) and will receive free registration for this ACS meeting, be reimbursed up to \$1000 towards travel, and be given 1 year free membership to the I&EC Division. While not required, it is customary for the nominator to organize an honorary symposium around the nominee's area of expertise in conjunction with the I&EC Programming Chair.

I&EC Applied Chemical Technology Fellow (up to one awarded annually)

An Associates or Bachelors degreed (terminal) chemist or engineer from an academic, industrial, or government laboratory who has made significant, innovative contributions to the area of applied chemistry or engineering over the course of their career. The awardees will be recognized at and be asked to contribute a talk (optional) to the I&EC awards symposium (typically at the spring meeting the ACS) and will receive free registration for this ACS meeting, be reimbursed up to \$1000 towards travel, and be given 1 year free membership to the I&EC Division.
