Diana K. Deese has a degree in electrical engineering technology (Michigan Technological University) which has provided the basis for a career spanning 35 years in Research and Development/Analytical Science. Her current position is in Surface and Interface Characterization at Dow in Midland Michigan. Diana's occupational adventures have included secret government projects, working on military subsystems, advancing silicon carbide wafering technologies, interlayer dielectrics for the electronic industry, and customized sample preparation techniques for a multitude of surface and interface analysis methods on a plethora of Dow initiatives.
